| Alianzas entre animales | Report | Science: Living things | A symbiotic relationship is a partnership between two animals of different species that spend most or all of their lives living closely together. There are different types of symbiotic relationships. |
| Recolectores de miel | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | The Hadza people and the honeyguide bird have a mutual relationship where both parties benefit. The characters in a narrative can change and develop throughout the story. People from different cultures can learn from each other. |
| Restaurar los arrecifes de coral | Report | Science: Living things – ecosystems | Coral reefs are important ecosystems that are home to a huge range of marine animals. Coral reefs are in danger of being destroyed because of human behavior. Scientists are working on different ways to restore coral reefs. |
| Corales coloridos | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | Characters can go through a range of emotions in a story. Characters can learn about themselves through difficult situations or challenges. Some marine biologists are helping to restore coral reefs. |
| Animales en peligro: El orangután | Report | Science: Living things Social Studies: Geography | Human activities in industry and everyday life have had major effects on land. People are influenced by both positive and negative emotions when making decisions. |
| La jornada de Ahmad | Narrative | Science: Living things Language Arts: English | Characters are influenced by both positive and negative factors. A character's actions and dialogue help the reader to understand the character's feelings. |
| Descubrir el mundo perdido | Report | Science: Science at work Social Studies: Geography | Remote, isolated places are often untouched by people and remain in a natural, pristine state. Wildlife that is isolated develops in unique and different ways. |
| La exploración de las islas Galápagos | Narrative | Science: Science at work Language Arts: Literature – journal | Fictional stories are sometimes based on factual events. Characters have a certain way of speaking and acting that reflects the story's setting. |

| Liderar el camino | Biographies | Social Studies: Civics – roles and responsibilities | Different leaders have different leadership styles. Many leaders face opposition and challenges. Successful leaders usually have similar personal qualities. |
| Un líder improbable | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | Characters can change and develop throughout a narrative. The way a character reacts to challenges can reveal information about that character's personal qualities. |
| Vivir con robots | Report | Engineering and technology | Computers and robots perform many jobs and tasks that people once had to do. People use computers, robots, and artificial intelligence (AI) at home, at work, and for fun. AI technology will continue to develop, but it is limited to the information that people program into it. |
| Milo y los robots | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | Computers, robots, and AI have changed the way people live. In the future, people will use computers, robots, and AI more and more. Computers, robots, and AI are helpful, but not all people regard them as essential. |
| La lucha por los derechos de los niños: La historia de Lewis Hine | Biography | Social Studies: History Language Arts: Literature – biography | Child labor was once common in the United States and children were often exploited. Lewis Hine used his photographs to help change child labor laws and protect children's rights. |
| Un dólar por día | Narrative | Social Studies: History Language Arts: Literature – historical fiction | Some events can change a character's life. A character's development can be shown by how they respond to particular events. |
| ¡La cámara no miente! | Interview | Technology | Photography has changed since the introduction of digital technology. Photographers use a range of techniques that allow them to take the "perfect" photo. |
| El notición | Narrative | Technology Language Arts: Literature | Characters develop as events in the story occur. The actions, thoughts, and words of a character indicate what their personality is like. |

| Internet y privacidad | Report | Engineering and technology | The meaning of “privacy” has changed with the development of technology. Once information is uploaded to the Internet it is no longer private. There is a balance between privacy and safety when considering what information should be made public. |
| ¡Etiquetado! | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | Being tagged or tagging someone online has consequences. Characters can experience a range of emotions throughout a story. |
| Regresar de la extinción | Report | Science: Living things | De-extinction is the science of bringing plants and animals back from extinction. There are lots of necessary factors in the success of de-extinction. There are a number of moral issues surrounding de-extinction. |
| El regreso del mamut lanudo | Narrative | Language Arts: Literature | A narrative can be set in a variety of places and times. Characters can have different views on an issue, and these can be related to their experiences and culture. |
| La vida en los climas extremos | Report | Language Arts: Literature | Living in extreme climates can be fatal for people if they are not prepared. Some people have adapted to extreme temperatures but most of us need modern technology to live comfortably in these places. |
| En el desierto | Narrative | Social Studies: Geography Language Arts: Literature | Narratives can include characters’ reflections and memories about events in their lives. A character’s personality can be tested when they’re faced with a dramatic event. |
| El misterio de las pirámides | Report | Social Studies: History Engineering: Design | Pyramids are huge structures that were built in Egypt in ancient times. There are different theories about how and why the pyramids were built, and who actually built them. |
| Rey por una semana | Narrative | Engineering: Design Language Arts: Literature – historical fiction | Narratives can include historical facts related to the setting of the story. A character’s words, thoughts, and actions reflect the time and place in which the story is set. |
